FARENJECT is not suitable for patients in some conditions.

- Pregnancy in the first trimester
- Dialysis
- Allergy to Ferric Carboxymaltose
- Iron overload/haemochromotosis
- Non-iron deficiency Anaemia
- Fever/Sepsis
